

Conditions of Entry and General Information

1. Entry is open to MV Accredited and Non MV Accredited Sheep. All consignors must be a full Member of the Society provided their subscriptions are up to date.
2. All sheep must be double tagged. The vendor shall be responsible for the correctness of identity. Any tags which are tampered with, handwritten/bear marks, are faulty or illegible will be rejected from the sale.
3. PRE-SALE INSPECTION All sheep forward for the sale will be subject to a Society inspection. Any animal which does not reach the Inspection standard will not be eligible for sale. **The inspection decision will be final and any animal failed must be removed immediately from the sale and forfeit the entry fee. No appeal is permitted.**
4. All sheep entered for the sale must be fully pedigree registered prior to the closing date of entries. All pedigree certificates must be forwarded with the entry form.
5. All sheep will be sold in guineas (105 pence) and a commission of 5.5% will be charged by the Auctioneers on all sales.
6. A Society Levy of 1% will be deducted from the vendors account and paid to the British Dorper Sheep Society.
7. Scrapie Genotyping is voluntary. Genotype information to be displayed in the sale catalogue must be supported by valid genotype certificates forwarded along with the sale entry forms and pedigree certificates.
8. Entry Fee – a fee of £10 + VAT per head will be charged on all entries. Cheques to be made payable to Harrison & Hetherington Ltd and must accompany the completed entry form. Entry fees are non-refundable.
9. Details of any substitute MUST be submitted to the auctioneers/society secretary 24 hours prior to the sale.
10. The Sale will be held subject to the Rules and Regulations of the Livestock Auctioneers Association and the Auctioneers Standard Conditions of Sale

Acceptance of stock: The arrival of stock can only be accepted onto the market premises within the time period stated in the sale catalogue. Any alteration will be notified to all vendors, however we request that all arrival times must be strictly adhered to when published in the catalogue.

Export to Northern Ireland: As of 1 January 2021, the rules for exporting sheep from the United Kingdom to Northern Ireland and the European Union have changed for moving breeding stock to Northern Ireland
No Direct Export or Vendor Returns will be available.

It will be the responsibility of the purchaser and/or the vendor to make any necessary arrangements for sheep going to Northern Ireland.

Disclaimer: The responsibility for export of sheep rests with either the purchaser or the vendor and not Harrison & Hetherington Ltd nor the British Dorper Sheep Society.
