## Conditions of Entry & Rules

1. All vendors must be fully paid-up members of the Society.
  2. The sale is open to Non MV Accredited sheep only.
  3. **ALL SHEEP MUST BE FULLY REGISTERED AT POINT OF ENTRY.**
  4. All tags must comply with DEFRA / Scottish Government and Jacob Sheep Society regulations in force at the time of the sale. Sheep not correctly tagged (i.e. without UK and ID number / electronic tags may not be sold in **ANY** section of the sale.
  5. A sheep may be substituted for an original entry provided that any substitution is by a sheep in the same class and that both the Auctioneer and the Society Secretary are advised not later than 7 days prior to the Show and Sale. Any substitute sheep must be identified with *WHITE TAPE* around its *RIGHT-HAND* horn.
  6. All sheep entered for any show and sale must be onsite and **penned by 7.30am** on the day of the show and sale. Late arrivals will be excluded from the show and sale.
  7. No sheep may be sold as registered at any sale unless the registration form for such sheep is lodged at the office of the Society Secretary at least **TWENTY-ONE** days before the relevant sale.
  8. All registered sheep entered and forward at any sale must be inspected to ensure their ear tag numbers tally with the catalogue and that they comply with the Society's breed standard.  
Shearlings showing more than two broad teeth can be sold but **cannot** go forward for the show.  
All four-horned sheep must have wool, hair and/or skin between the top and side horns, even if only a very small amount, to pass the inspection.  
Should there be any slight faults with older sheep that the Inspectors wish to pass, the vendor will be informed, and the Auctioneer will announce the fault before the sheep is sold. Should the vendor refuse permission for this announcement, the sheep will fail its inspection. The Inspectors' decision will be final.
- Horn Tape Colours:**
- a. All substitutes will have White tape on their horn.
  - b. Rejected sheep will have red tape and will not be forward for sale.
  - c. Those sheep that pass the inspection but need an announcement from the Auctioneer at the time of sale e.g an older sheep that is slightly sharp on its mouth will have Blue tape on their horn.
9. The vendor must lodge a Society Registration Certificate marked with the lot number with the Auctioneer for any registered sheep offered for sale.
  10. No ewes will be accepted for any Sale if they have been running with a ram.

11. Tay-Sachs - The Tay-Sachs status of all entries i.e tested clear, bred clear, carrier or untested must be declared on the entry form.
12. Only rosettes that have been won on the day of the Show and Sale may be displayed at the sheep pens. **NO OTHER ROSETTES MAY BE DISPLAYED** although details of previous successes may be displayed.
13. No sheep shall be sold at a sale that has not been entered in the sale catalogue or in the Auctioneer's late entry list. No other sheep may be brought to any sale unless the society secretary and the Auctioneer has been notified and permission given.
14. **ALL SHEEP SOLD MUST BE SOLD IN THE SALE RING OR THROUGH THE AUCTIONEER'S OFFICE.**

### **Harrison & Hetherington Ltd**

1. All Pedigree sheep will be sold in Guineas (£1.05) and in catalogue order, with commercial sheep being sold in Pounds Sterling (£'s). The Auctioneers to charge a commission of 5.5%. **The JSS will waive its right to a levy at this sale.**
2. Cleaning facilities for vehicles and trailers will be available on site for a nominal charge.
3. It is the vendors and purchasers responsibility to ensure that all DEFRA / Scottish Government rules and regulations are adhered to with regard to movement of sheep at the time.
4. Entry Fee: Pedigree sheep (per Lot) £8.50 plus VAT. No entry fee for Stores and Crossbreds.

# Update on BTV Control Strategy 2026



From 1<sup>st</sup> June to 9<sup>th</sup> September 2026 , additional bluetongue movement rules will apply as Scotland works to remain **\*\*BTV-free\*\*** during the midge season.

## **Selling English/Welsh livestock in Scotland (to live):**

Sheep – Must have a negative PCR test within 7 days before travelling to Scotland.

Cattle – Two options:

- Fully vaccinated with Bultavo-3 (21 days after final dose) – No test required
- Unvaccinated or other vaccine – PCR test within 7 days required

## **Selling Scottish livestock in an English/Welsh market and bringing cattle or sheep back to Scotland:**

No test needed to travel to the sale.

If cattle or sheep are in England/Wales 4 days or less:

- They can return to Scotland
- Isolation on return is strongly advised
- Post-movement test recommended

If cattle or sheep stay more than 4 days:

- PCR test required in England/Wales before returning to Scotland
- \*\*Vaccinated cattle (Bultavo-3) are exempt from PCR testing when returning.**
